Bills We're Watching:

Behavioral Health Services for Future Generations (BHSFG):

The decision packages that were approved by the Part B Budget Committee are expected to be heard by House Appropriations starting Wednesday afternoon, March 19th and continuing on the morning of Thursday, March 20th. Anyone who would like to give public comment should plan to attend both of these sessions. Anyone hoping to give virtual testimony should sign up for both of these sessions as the schedule is fluid.

The 3% Medicaid provider increase and the increases for Children's and Family Services Division in-home and shelter care rate increases will also be heard during the DPHHS section of House Appropriations.

 HB2, Appropriations. Behavioral Health Recommendations for Future Generations Recommendations. SUPPORT. The recommendations were heard in Part B DPHHS Budget Appropriations on February 24, 2025. Below is a list of the recommendations discussed and which passed/failed.

DP 10728 (BHSFG #18) - RST/BIEN Updated, school-based BH initiatives – not offered originally, later substitute motion (Fox) to cut in half - PASSED

DP 10729 – (BHSFG #19) updated, BH and DD Workforce incentives – (RST/BIEN) added OTO - PASSED

Medicaid Expansion:

<u>HB245</u>, Senator Buttrey, is on the Governor's desk after passing both the House and the Senate! **BHAM strongly supports this bill**.

Medicaid Rate Reimbursement:

A Decision Package (DP) was moved by Sen. Kerr-Carpenter to increase Medicaid providers rate by 3% for this biennium at the Part B Budget Committee in HB2.

1. <u>HB419</u> (Bedey). This bill will allow DPHHS to review cost reports for Medicaid providers in senior and long-term care, mental health, substance use disorder and intellectual developmentally disabled programs every other year. Medicaid providers are already 5 years behind costs in reimbursement. **BHAM strongly supports this bill and encourages advocacy efforts to move it forward with the understanding that cost reporting adjustments need to occur every two years.**

School-Based Mental Health:

SB95 (Yakawich), a bill for suicide prevention will be heard on Monday, March 17th at 10:00 a.m. in Senate Finance and Claims Committee. BHAM supports this bill.

SB521 (Pope), a bill for OPI and DPHHS to develop school-based mental health will be heard in the Senate Education and Cultural Resources Committee on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 at 3:00 p.m. BHAM supports this bill.

Mental Health Screening Insurance Rules:

SB244 (Yakawich) will be heard on Tuesday, March 17th at 8:00 am in House Business and Labor.
